Traffic: When the Wegmans store opened we had a large contingent of officers working to keep traffic moving. Our officers did a great job on opening day, keeping backups to a minimum. The improvement made to the roadways between Chestnut Ridge Rd and Pascack Hills HS have handled the shopping area traffic with ease. We are still working with Bergen County engineers on the timing of the light at Grand Ave. and Spring Valley Rd., but I anticipate that to be sorted out soon.

Spring Valley Rd and Summit Ave - We are waiting for the utility companies to move their wires from the old utility poles to the new ones at the intersection. Traffic will flow much better once that project is complete.

Holiday Season is almost on us.

Holiday Season Safety reminders: Be smart and safe while shopping at the malls. Avoid going alone. Park under street lights at night. Park as close to the entrance as you can. Have your keys ready before you get to your car. Lock the door as soon as you get in – even before you start the engine. Inside the stores, do not “flash” your cash. Give only the ID and credit card needed for the purchase. Make sure you are not being followed – especially after making an expensive purchase. If you feel unsafe, ask security to walk you to your car. Carry a loud whistle. Protect yourself.

Holiday Season Safety reminder #2: The Holiday Season also brings holiday parties and holiday celebrations that “holiday cheer” may be served at. Don’t ruin your holiday season by getting arrested for D.W.I. or worse – by crashing into someone and injuring or killing them. Get a designated driver. Call friends or family for a ride. Call a car service, limo service, Uber, or a taxi (there are several taxi companies in the area). Just don’t drink and drive. MPD will have increased DWI patrol and roadblocks during from late November until after the New Year as part of a national campaign against drunk driving. Enjoy your holidays responsibly.

Scams – As usual there are some despicable individuals looking to take advantage of others misfortune and make a profit by scamming well-meaning citizens out of charitable donations. This time in connection with the recent hurricanes. When you make donations take the time to check and see if your money is going to a real and reputable charitable organization. Fall activities and winter preparations are in full swing for all of us now that we are in November. Our DPW’s equipment and contractors’ plans are being reviewed and prepared for what may be a heavy snow winter season as predicted by some experts. The road improvements and the paving program should all conclude by end of October. Most of the intersection work on Grand Avenue/Spring Valley Road, and Summit Avenue/Spring Valley Road should be coming to an end.

The Wegman’s grand opening on September 24th was a success by all accounts. About 20,000 people shopped at Wegman’s and went home safely. All the traffic and parking plans worked perfectly even with an unrelated gas leak on Grand Avenue on the Park Ridge side. A big shout out to our Police Department, Fire Department and Tri-Boro Ambulance for the planning and the work they did weeks before and on opening day.

At the time of writing this article, we are in the midst of litigation on several fronts as it relates to affordable housing, and not much that can be shared during this transitional time.
