

Mayor's Message



Dear Residents,

In mid-2017, the Bergen Rockland Eruv Association and seven individual residents in New York filed an action in Federal Court seeking to compel the Borough to permit the erection of an eruv within Montvale. Plaintiffs alleged, in essence, that the expansion of the eruv into Montvale was necessary in order for them to fully practice their religion. They claimed that permitting the erection of the eruv was a reasonable accommodation of Plaintiffs' religious beliefs. I had issued a work stop order to not allow any pvc pipes on utility poles back in July 2017 and mandated that no pvc pipes are to be installed without the permission of the Borough.

The Governing Body carefully considered existing precedent on this issue and consulted both with counsel and with representatives for Mahwah and Upper Saddle River as well as other municipalities in the state that currently have an eruv. Ultimately, the Governing Body determined that the most prudent course of action was to attempt reach a settlement that would work for both Montvale and the Plaintiffs without needlessly expending significant amounts of taxpayer funds.

Montvale has always been a welcoming and diverse community, and it was in this spirit that negotiations took place with Plaintiffs' representatives over many months. Meetings were held all over Montvale – from Borough Hall to our residents' own homes – to try find an acceptable solution. I was in constant communication with Rabbi Chaim Steinmetz and with dozens of residents to try to identify a boundary for the eruv that would accommodate the needs of the Plaintiffs without costly and time-consuming litigation.

The geography of our town is such that we have houses on the border where their front yard is in New Jersey and backyard is in New York. The Plaintiffs live in New York but need to walk on New Jersey streets to go back to New York. There are houses on Foxhill Road and Wren Way that pay property taxes to Montvale and to New York - very odd but that's how it's been set up.

We originally explored other alternatives that would have included fewer properties in Montvale within the eruv and utilized fewer utility poles. This was acceptable to the Rabbi if the eruv boundary could be established and still include all of the Plaintiffs and other individuals who needed to be within the eruv borders. The only way for such a plan to have worked was with full voluntary compliance from the affected residents. It became apparent, and rightly so, that some residents did not want the eruv to be located on their private property (whether it was a post, a fence or just a wire). The second best plan is the current plan in the settlement minimizing the eruv route to what is needed to close the loop with the existing eruv system in New York State.

This is our best option especially knowing full well that we could spend upwards of a million dollars and still end up with an eruv, and then have to explain to you why we spent that much money knowing the odds against us. I do want to thank all those who stepped up and offered their help as one community and as a one town, you know who you are. Other towns spent six figures just to settle and ended up with an eruv and agreements for further expansion. While I recognize that some members of our community may disagree, I believe that the settlement agreement that was approved is the best way for Montvale to move forward, and I take full responsibility for our action.


Hello Montvale,

2018 Montvale Recreation Summer Camp Changes

July 2nd – July 27th (No Camp on July 4th) Monday – Friday 9:30AM – 2:30PM Memorial Drive

Montvale Recreation will be extending summer camp hours beginning in 2018. Camp hours will now be 9:30AM-2:30PM. This will allow more time to expand the scope of our activities, entertainment and overall structure of camp. The following changes will be incorporated this summer to account for the ten extra hours per week:

- Additional space and classrooms at Memorial School for our use
- The installation of a large tent with picnic tables on the swim club field to provide shade for activities and lunch (non-rain days). Rain day lunch will take place in Memorial and the Community Center.
- •The option of sending your camper with a lunch (which will be stored in an indoor, air-conditioned facility) OR hot lunches can be pre-ordered.
- •Pre-ordered lunches will be prepared by Big Daddy's at the Snack Shack and served to campers at their designated lunch time. Parents will be able to choose which days their camper receives a hot lunch. The menu will include the following lunch options at \$5 a day:
- •Hamburger or Cheeseburger with French Fries and a drink
- •Chicken Fingers with French Fries and a drink
- •Hot Dog with French Fries and a drink
- •Pizza with a drink
- •Off Site Trips (for an additional cost) for the 6th and 7th Graders w/ provided transportation
- •Campers will be able to utilize the water inflatables for a longer period of time.
- •Increased variation and quantity of camp entertainment as well as activities.

Camp Fees: The fee for summer camp has been increased this year only to account for the additional hours at camp. The hourly rate per camper has actually been decreased to offset the overall cost.

Resident Fee for all 4 weeks of Camp: \$320 per child (Family Max- \$960)
Non-Resident Fee for all 4 weeks of Camp: \$380 per child (Family Max- \$1140)

RESIDENT/NON-RESIDENT: \$30 Additional Fee after Registration Period. \$25 late charge for every 15 minutes a child is left under care after camp dismissal. Payment shall be made directly to the Camp Director or Asst. Director and turned over to the Borough of Montvale.

Camper Registration Time Period: March 1st through May 1st. After May 1st, you are not guaranteed a spot in camp and you'll incur a late registration fee. Sign up online by going to montavle.org/Recreation or pickup a paper registration from Borough Hall between 8:30AM and 4:30PM, Monday-Friday.

The facilities, courts and playground on Memorial Drive are CLOSED to the public during camp days and hours (July 2nd-July 27th Monday-Friday 9:30am-2:30pm). The public will be able to access the area any day after 2:30pm. For anyone looking to use the tennis courts during camp hours, we have three tennis courts at our Chestnut Ridge Recreation Complex located at 18 Heather Ridge Lane. Thank you in advance for your cooperation as we strive to keep our campers safe.


