Holiday Season is almost on us.

Holiday Season Safety reminders: Be smart and safe while shopping at the malls. Avoid going alone. Park under street lights at night. Park as close to the entrance as you can. Have your keys ready before you get to your car. Lock the door as soon as you get in – even before you start the engine. Inside the stores, no not “flash” your cash. Give only the ID and credit card needed for the purchase. Make sure you are not being followed – especially after making an expensive purchase. If you feel unsafe, ask security to walk you to your car. Carry a loud whistle. Protect yourself.



Holiday Season Safety reminder #2: The Holiday Season also brings holiday parties and holiday celebrations that “holiday cheer” may be served at. Don’t ruin your holiday season by getting arrested for D.W.I. or worse – by crashing into someone and injuring or killing them. Get a designated driver. Call friends or family for a ride. Call a car service, limo service, Uber, or a taxi (there are several taxi companies in the area). Just don’t drink and drive. MPD will have increased DWI patrol and roadblocks during from late November until after the New Year as part of a national campaign against drunk driving. Enjoy your holidays responsibly.

Scams – As usual there are some despicable individuals looking to take advantage of others misfortune and make a profit by scamming well-meaning citizens out of charitable donations. This time in connection with the recent hurricanes. When you make donations take the time to check and see if your money is going to a real and reputable charitable organization. Visit charitynavigator.org, give.org, charitywatch.org or other reputable charity evaluation sites before donating.

Montvale PD has a Project Medicine Drop receptacle at the Police Station. It is a safe way to get rid of your old, expired, unused, or unwanted medications. Don’t flush them down the drain or put in trash – they can be dangerous to the environment. And don’t leave them around to get mixed up with any current prescriptions. Just drop them in the box at the PD where we send them to get destroyed properly. And its free!

As we begin to see the changes in our weather and the inevitable snow and ice that is sure to come, I would like to remind all residents that it is their responsibility to make sure that leaves are not left in the streets to be picked up by your landscape contractor at some future date. These leaves get washed into storm drains and require a lot of DPW time and money to clean out. This also assures that storm water systems operate properly when we have heavy rains during this time.

Once the snow starts to fall, please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the property owner to remove ice and snow from all sidewalks that front on all sides of your property. Sidewalks must remain passable at all times. While I know this can be a frustrating endeavor as plows go by and plow in what was just shoveled, it is important to remember that roadways are the priority in order for emergency vehicles to move about town. Removal of snow soon after a snowfall will reduce the potential for it to turn to ice and be more difficult to remove later on. By doing so, we will be able to provide safe and passable sidewalks during the upcoming winter. I thank everybody in advance for their efforts and cooperation.
