While we are all enjoying last days of summer and preparing for the fall activities, we are gearing up for the Holiday and snow preparation. Hard to think about that with 80-degree weather but we are getting ready for a busy snow season. We have been actively renegotiating the contract with Rivervale's DPW and looking for options to fine tune the four year old contract to make it more equitable and a fair contract for both of our towns. There are also opportunities to include other services to share and include other towns as well with certain services. The county has also offered to share some services and as soon as we can do the due diligence and analyze the benefits, we will share them and invite your input.

I have met with many residents during the last few months on local issues and some that are not within our control. We all agree on keeping our town's character and appearance, and because of that, we pass certain ordinances, such as the tree, no marijuana/smoke shops, no knock, adjust speed limits, and several other ordinances. Some

issues are not easy to handle by a single town, such as the deer issue. We can spend money and energy to curb the deer population in Montvale but we can't stop deer from coming and passing

through from neighboring towns. So this becomes a regional issue and for multiple towns to join with the county for a unified solution. I don't thing we are there yet; I haven't seen any one unified initiative. I have reached out to Saddle River and Upper Saddle River mayors to join in a solution but did not get a positive response.

The Halloween Season will be here. Use extra caution operating your vehicle on Halloween. The Trick-or-Treaters may be preoccupied in the pursuit of goodies and forget proper safety measures when out that evening. Unfortunately "Mischief Night", "Cabbage Night", "Goosey Night" or whatever one wishes to call the evening of vandalism the night before Halloween is also upon us. Do not mistake the evening's events as innocent. In the past our police

In the past our police officers confiscated fireworks, spray-paint, nail polish remover, Nair, pepper-spray, lighter fluid, knives, BB guns, paintball guns as well as the more traditional toilet paper, shaving cream and eggs. These items were in the possession of a number of different kids. There is no free pass for littering, vandalism or criminal mischief on that or any other night. Damaging the property of others is not a "rite of passage" for teens. Let

the vandals stay on their own property and damage their own mailboxes, cars, and houses. There will be a Zero Tolerance Policy in effect from the police department. We will charge anyone caught committing unlawful acts.

As a reminder, Montvale PD has a permanent drop box for unwanted, unused and expired drugs and prescriptions located in the lobby of the Police Station. Old or unused medications and prescriptions can be disposed of safely.



As we begin to see the changes in our weather and the inevitable snow and ice that is sure to come, I would like to remind all residents that it is their responsibility to make sure that leaves are not left in the streets to be picked up by your landscape contractor at some future date. These leaves get washed into storm drains and require a lot of DPW time and money to clean out. This also assures that storm water systems operate properly when we have heavy rains during this time.

Once the snow starts to fall, please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the property owner to remove ice and snow from all sidewalks that front on all sides of your property. Sidewalks must remain passable at all times. While I know this can be a frustrating endeavor as plows go by and plow in what was just shoveled, it is important to remember that roadways are the priority in order for emergency vehicles to move about town. Removal of snow soon after a snowfall will reduce the potential for it to turn to ice and be more difficult to remove later on. 

The Montvale Tree Ordinance

Earlier in 2018 the Borough of Montvale enacted an ordinance to help control indiscriminant removal of trees during specific construction events. The ordinance describes when trees may be removed and what must be done when trees are removed from specific protected locations on a property. The new ordinance also has a section regulating use of invasive plants in the borough such as Bamboo. Though the Montvale Environmental Commission reviews and makes recommendations regarding all tree removal applications, the process is managed through the Montvale Building Department and the Montvale Planning and Zoning Board. The application is simple and no application fee is required.

The ordinance is not intended to affect the general public from removing trees from their property or have any significant effect on those who want to perform construction on their property. In fact the ordinance does not come into effect unless some sort of building or site work is being planned.

Bob Hanrahan, Chairman of the Montvale Environmental Commission stated that "early on we realized that some of the clear-cut tree complaints brought to the attention of the Borough would not have been as severe if the property owner understood more about the value of trees, so we developed an information flyer for property owners which describe reasons to maintain trees."

After the public education effort they investigated methods to limit the situations which residents were complaining about; "We didn't want to end up with more regulations which infringe on our rights to do what we want on our property". He continued "yet during our investigation we discovered many instances where residents were negatively impacted by abutting property owners who simply cut down most or all of the trees from a property, often in preparation for construction. Construction is the time when you want foliage on a property so we focused on just that." He concluded with "This is one of those situations where it doesn't seem like a big deal until it happens next door to you". After many years of work the Montvale tree ordinance appears to be good balance of protecting our local environment while limiting infringement on property owners.

The ordinance describes numerous exclusions including situations where a tree is dead or diseased or any situation where a tree is causing a potential hazard. As development continues here in Montvale the Environmental Commission is working hard to help minimize negative effects on neighboring property owners, and help to maintain the look and feel of the community that we all want to enjoy long into the future.

In Summary here is what the Montvale Tree Ordinance is and isn't

What it Does

- Reduces clear cutting during construction
- Helps Maintain visual buffers around properties
- Reduces impact of construction on adjacent properties
- Is only necessary if you are involved with construction on your property
- Is free and easy to apply for

What it Doesn't Do

- Does NOT stop the public from removing trees from their property when not performing construction
- Does NOT prevent you from placing an addition or deck on your home
- Does NOT prohibit immediate tree removal when a hazard exists
