The Mayor's Corner

Rain Tax and Montvale

I have been receiving a number of questions from residents about the so-called "Rain Tax" bill that was passed by the Legislature and is awaiting signature from the Governor. I have been monitoring this legislation, and I want to provide you with a brief overview of the potential impact of this law.

The new law would allow (but not require) municipalities and counties to establish local stormwater utilities that would be allowed to charge property owners based on the amount of stormwater runoff generated on their properties. Because of the manner in which any runoff charges would be imposed, the largest impacts would almost necessarily be felt by larger commercial or industrial properties with large impervious surfaces that generate a substantial amount of runoff. Smaller residential properties, if they were taxed at all, would be unlikely to see any significant charges.

However, I can assure you that the Borough of Montvale has no plans to create any such utility. It is certainly possible that the County of Bergen could create a stormwater utility, although I am not aware of any plans to do so at this time. Prior to the creation of any such utility, there would likely be ample opportunity for you and elected officials

to comment and make our voices heard at the County level. Prior to even reaching that step, however, the NJ DEP would have to create rules to implement the law. This would provide further opportunity for public comment on any proposed regulations.

Stormwater management is important to all of us, which is why the impact of new developments on stormwater runoff is already analyzed by the Borough in connection with applications that are proposed in town. I will continue to monitor this legislation if it is in fact passed by Governor Murphy, and I will provide an update if any rules or regulations are proposed that would impact our residents.

We have been asking residents to sign up for our Swift Reach Reverse 911 system. This is an automated emergency notification system that allows us to send out alerts via phone and email to registered businesses and residents. More information, and the sign up screen are available on the Borough website at Montvale.org, under the "Resident" tab.

We will also be launching our "Community Camera" program this month. The Police Department will be asking residents and business owners with surveillance camera systems to register them if they are willing to provide video in the event of a crime in the area. The program does not give the Police Department direct access to your camera system, and is strictly voluntary. The registration form is available on the Borough website, or at the Police Department front desk.



Board of Health offers American Heart Association Heart Saver CPR/AED Training Class

Spring is ideal for many things. It is the beginning of playing outdoor sports, and family outings begin to occur more. The days grow longer, and the excitement of being outside becomes apparent. The fun activities of spring and summer open the door to greater risk for injury. Rising temperatures increase the risk of heat-related illness and cardiac arrest. You may not always be prepared for unforeseen problems but having CPR/AED training is a great idea.

Residents are encouraged to take this opportunity to register for the American Heart Association Training class being offered this spring. The Montvale Board of Health in conjunction with Hackensack Meridian Health Hackensack University Medical Center are offering free classes to residents 13 years and older. Participants will be charged a fee for the certification ID card. In an effort to help defray the cost the Board of Health will absorb a portion of the fee. Participants will be responsible to pay \$10 for the card.

Ways Residents Can Help the Waterways

The Board of Health is asking residents to help prevent municipal drains from blockage which effects our waterway and aquatic system.

Non-biodegradable products effect the environment negatively. Disposable adult or baby diapers, medical or food disposal gloves, personal hygiene or make-up removal wipes, or defecting wipes should not be flushed down the toilet. These disposal products such as those are made of cloth like material, do not break down in the sanitary sewer system and can block sewer lines. This increases our municipality's maintenance and repair costs. Pascack Valley DPW employees have experienced an increase with this problem in recent years because more products are on the market and the consumer demand for disposal and antibacterial products has increased. The Board of Health is asking residents or any commercial establishment to dispose of these types of wipes in the trash can. Many people may be unaware of that even some flushable wipes are not compatible with our municipal sewer system. This problem is affecting many municipalities throughout the state. New Jersey lawmakers are hard at work, trying to make sure non-flushable disposable wipes are properly disposed of. Legislation is pending in the state Senate Commerce Committee that would require all non-flushable disposable wipes to be labeled "Do Not Flush" in the future.

The Tatlog Tradition The term "tallog" derives from the cries of the 17th & 18th century Law Country innivespers in Scotland, who, as the files and drums of the local regiment signaled a return to quarters would cry, "Due den tap toet" (meening "Turn off the taps!). The sound of the "teps" caused the innkeepers customers to depent and return to their betrecks. The word "taltoo" evolved over time and refers to what developed as a commonial performance of militery music by massed bands today. The Virginia International Tetloo incorporates groups from around the world including acrobats, chorel groups and precision military drill teams.
