The Mayor's Corner

During this time of the year, we find new potholes showing up overnight after the past long winter. The PVDPW have been filling potholes every day when it is not raining, while the Borough Engineers are preparing plans to spend \$1.4 million to mill and pave about 14 streets around town. We have been spending a million dollars every year maintaining and paving streets on a rotating basis. Heavily traveled main roadways last about 15 years while less traveled side streets can last up 30 years with proper maintenance. Please continue to report potholes on your street, and we will publish all the streets that will be paved this year later in May.

The budget for this year looks great with zero municipal tax increase, even with spending \$1.4 million on roads, \$5.4 million in surplus, AAA bond rating. The good news is that we are expecting additional revenue in the next several years to keep taxes flat and may even be able to lower the rate.

I want to give a shout out to the Montvale Environmental Commission and their volunteers

headed by Bob Hanrahan for their hard work and for their planning and executing the Montvale Clean-up day that took place on Saturday April 13. It makes a big difference when the public gets involved with care and passion to keep our community clean.

Lastly, the Planning Board has been reviewing the input with the former Sony and the former Mercedes site plans. These hearing are ongoing and open to the public, I hope you find the time to attend some of these meetings and take part in the process. As usual, I am always available to discuss any matter related to our town and would be happy to attend Homeowners Association meetings and give you an update on our projects and respond to your questions. Summer is almost here, but schools are still open. Please drive carefully and DON'T text and drive as we are running a heavy campaign against texting while driving.

Montvale Fire Prevention Bureau

Fire Prevention Bureau would like to remind Montvale residents who are selling or renting their residences to schedule a fire prevention inspection. New Jersey requires all residential properties being sold or rented to schedule a fire prevention code inspection. Smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors and a fire extinguisher are required by New Jersey law. Detail requirements and the application are available on the borough website, under fire prevention or at borough hall. Also, a Continue Certificate of Occupancy (CCO) is required from the Building Department.

The fire prevention code inspection is valid for six months- please schedule your inspection once the closing date has been determined. Inspections are conducted on Tuesdays between the hours of 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. 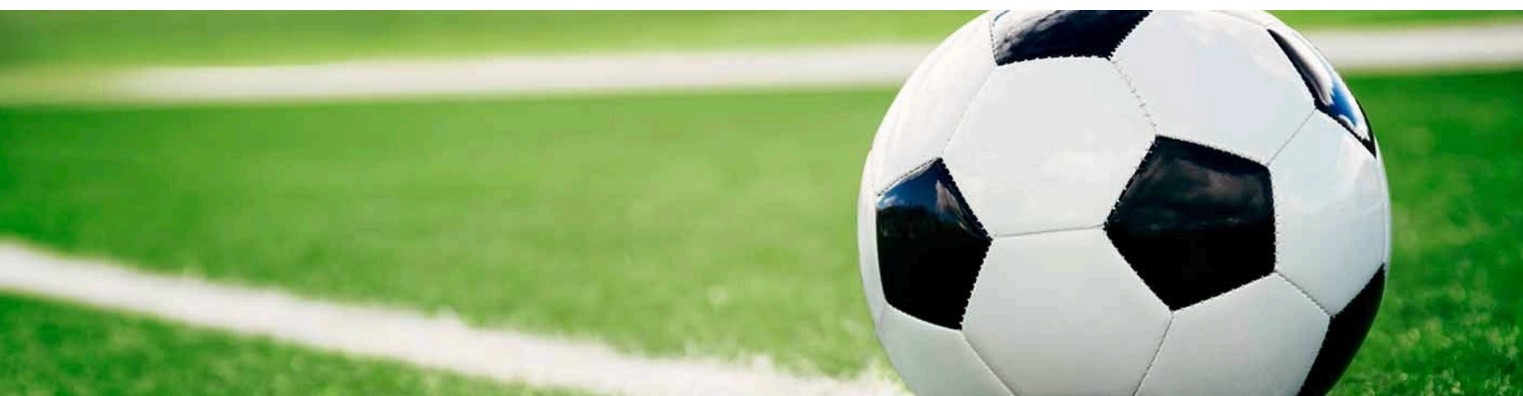

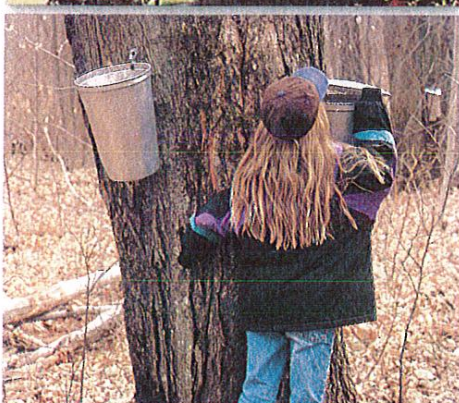
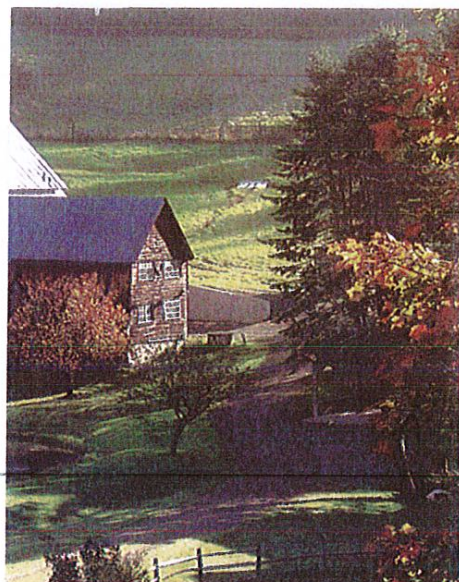

Driver Licenses

The Mobile Units provide the opportunity for drivers to renew their license, obtain a duplicate license, change their name or address on their license, add a boat endorsement, add a veteran designation, register to vote and/or make organ donation selections.

Initial licenses are currently not available in the Mobile Units.

Non-Driver Identification Cards

The Mobile Units can provide residents with photo identification that may then serve as a primary or secondary form of personal ID.



Wheelchair Accessible

MVC Mobile Units are wheelchair accessible and easy for all to use.

Registrations

Drivers may renew their registration or obtain a duplicate registration card for their vehicle in the Mobile Units.

License Plates

The Mobile Units allow drivers the option to surrender license plates.

Placards

Drivers may obtain a Persons with a Disability, Purple Heart, or Disabled Veteran placard from the Mobile Units.

Examination Permits

Customers can apply for an examination permit to take a written (law/knowledge) test. However, the written test itself is not available in the Mobile Units. Please visit njmvc.gov for test locations.

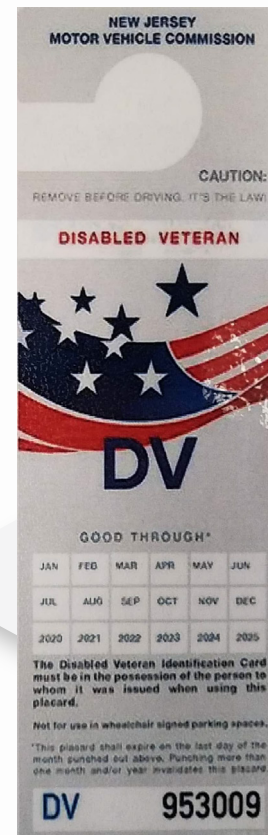

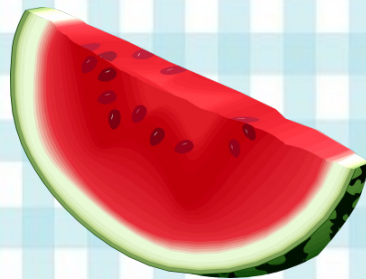
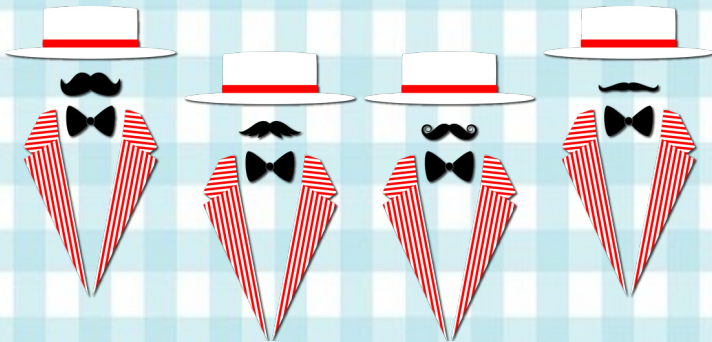
