We will be having our reorganization meeting on Sunday January 2nd, 2022, at 12PM. We will also have special dedicated budget meetings beginning, Monday, January 10th at 6:00 PM, Monday, January 24th at 6:00 PM and Monday, January 31st at 6:00 PM.

Our vaccination level in town is about 89%, higher than the state and the national average. If you are able to take the vaccine and the booster shots, I encourage you to do so. 



Badges will no longer need to be swiped, but rather just moved within a close proximity to the reader.
