

June has a been a relatively busy month for us with the different projects and summer preparation. The Memorial Day Parade was held for the first time in two years, although few of us and the scouts marched the parade route last year. Unfortunately, the street fair was postponed to October 23rd because of the weather; the fair in October will be even better with a Halloween theme.

The Magnolia Bridge seems to be on schedule with an accelerated work process after a brief setback, because of footings and underground stabilizers issues. Expected completion date is around end of September or early October of this year. With that comes the Woodland/Grand Ave light discussion, to keep it or to remove it. While originally, we expected a permanent light, the county is evaluating efficiency and safety of having the permanent light. After

adjusting the timing of the light, I have

been receiving an overwhelming in favor of keeping the light response. We will lobby the county to put in a permanent light.



You will see a slew of road work from paving to water pipe replacement projects in town this summer. Please be careful as you navigate through the detours, and watch for children and bikers.

July 2022 Borough Newsletter

I hope everyone is enjoying their Summer. As the 4th of July approaches, invariably, we begin investigating fireworks complaints. Below, you will find the law as it pertains to fireworks possession in New Jersey. Have a happy, safe, July 4th.

NEW JERSEY AND FIREWORKS

Under the New Jersey Explosives and Fireworks Act (N.J.S.A. 21:2-1 et seq., as amended by P.L.2017, C.92):



- It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, possess, or use fireworks anywhere in the State without a valid permit. However, recent changes to the law now permit persons 16 years of age or older to lawfully buy, possess and use certain sparkling devices and novelties. These permissible fireworks are limited to hand held or ground-based sparklers, snakes, and glow worms; smoke devices; and trick noisemakers, including party poppers, snappers, and drop pops. The sale, possession and use of all other fireworks requires a valid permit.
- The valid permit must be issued by any municipality after receiving an application in writing and the posting of a bond, for the display of fireworks, by municipalities, religious, fraternal or civic organizations, fair associations, amusement parks, or other organizations or groups of individuals approved by the municipality;
 The chiefs of the police and fire departments must approve the permit;
- An identification number and the specific type of fireworks to be used must be stated on the permit. The permit shall name one person who shall be authorized to purchase, or otherwise order, and receive delivery of any fireworks.
- A person is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree if he or she sells, offers or exposes for sale, or possesses with intent to sell, any fireworks, other than sparkling devices and novelties to persons 16 years of age or older.
- A person is guilty of a petty disorderly person's offense if he or she purchases, uses, discharges, causes to be discharged, ignites, fires or otherwise sets in action, or possesses fireworks without having the required permit.

Any business that advertises, offers to sell or sells fireworks to residents of New Jersey is required to clearly and conspicuously disclose that fireworks, other than sparkling devices and novelties, are illegal to possess or use in New Jersey without a valid permit. Failure to do so would constitute a violation of the New Jersey Consumer Fraud Act and its regulations.

Property Maintenance/Code Enforcement

Happy Summer!

Code Enforcement, a division of the Building Department working to improve the appearance of the community and maintain standards of living. By ensuring safe, healthy places to live, work and play, it helps reduce the risk of declining property values and failing community pride.

Some friendly reminders in regard to garbage and lawns. Once garbage and/or recycling has been picked up remember to remove pails from street curb and put back to keep the streets clear. Rubbish shall not be placed in such designated areas earlier than 5:00 p.m. of the day prior to scheduled collections, and the empty receptacles shall be removed to areas not exposed to public view by 8:00 p.m. on the collection day.

We have come across vehicles that are being parked on front lawns and not in driveways on pavement. This is against code 305.7L. No person shall park any automobile or vehicle on any premises utilized for residential purposes other than on driveways servicing said premises. Please help keep our community safe and clean. Enjoy your summer.

Fire Prevention

As we approach our Independence Day celebrations, please practice safety at all times. Make sure your BBQ grill is clean and all gas/propane connections are in good working condition.

Keep all grills 15 feet from any structure. If you plan on using fireworks (which fire prevention recommends you leave to the professionals) please practice safe measures. Have your guests view from a safe distance and watch the kids. Have a fire extinguisher ready for use.

If an emergency accrues, please do not hesitate to call the Montvale Fire Department or the Tri - Boro Ambulance by dialing 911.

Flu Prevention

Montvale Board of Health will be hosting its annual flu vaccine clinic on Saturday, October 8, 2022. Did you know there is a simple way of protecting yourself from getting sick with the flu? Getting your annual flu vaccine has many benefits for you and your loved ones. According to the CDC, for a two year flu season, 6,400,000 – 11,000,000 flu illnesses have been predicted. This virus can cause unnecessary illness, doctor visits, hospitalizations and even deaths. Receiving an annual flu vaccine can enable you to continue with your lives and not miss anything.

The flu virus constantly changes so, to have the best protection, getting the vaccine each year is necessary. Protection from the virus decreases over time so receiving a vaccine annually helps your body make new antibodies to defend itself. In addition, individuals with chronic health conditions can decrease the risk of experiencing complications from the virus that can lead to hospitalizations. The vaccination benefit for pregnant women reduces the risk of complications from the virus and gives immunity to the baby for a few months after birth. Children starting at the age of six months and older can also receive a vaccine.

If you have questions or concerns about the flu vaccine, please talk to your healthcare provider. The Board of Health will be hosting its annual flu vaccine clinic on Saturday, October 8, 2022 at the Montvale Senior & Community Center. Details about the clinic will be coming soon.

There will be a \$10 fee for replacement badges. The Recreation Department has updated the tennis court's magnetic card reader to a proximity reader. Badges will no longer need to be swiped, but rather just moved within a close proximity to the reader. Pickleball Court Badges

Field Use

Applications and Hold Harmless forms must be completed and returned to the Recreation Department, Attn: Lisa Dent, with Liability Insurance and payment. Forms are available online and at the Borough Hall front counter. Permits will not be issued if the application is incomplete. All organizations must receive an approved permit from Lisa Dent prior to any field use.
