Fire Prevention

As we wind down the Thanksgiving feast we are now looking forward to Christmas, Hanukkah and New Year's celebrations. Here are some helpful fire prevention tips to keep you and your family safe for a fun holiday season.

1. Check all Christmas tree lights for any wear and tear (exposed wires, worn plugs and connectors).
2. Keep your Christmas tree well hydrated through the holiday.
3. Keep Christmas trees away from all open flame devices i.e.; candles, fireplaces.
4. DO NOT LEAVE your Christmas lights operating while no one is home.
5. Keep all Hanukkah candles away from combustible materials.
6. Once again, if you are deep frying your holiday meal, keep your fryer 15 feet from any structure and off any decks.
7. Always check your smoke/carbon monoxide detectors for proper operation.

Property Maintenance

As we begin to see the changes in our weather and the inevitable snow and ice that is sure to come, I would like to remind all residents that it is their responsibility to make sure that leaves are not left in the streets to be picked up by your landscape contractor at some future date. They cannot be leftover night. The homeowner is responsible to manage their landscapers and leaf pickup.

These leaves get washed into storm drains and require a lot of DPW time and money to clean out. This also assures that storm water systems operate properly when we have heavy rains during this time. Once the snow starts to fall, please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the property owner to remove ice and snow from all sidewalks that front on all sides of your property. Sidewalks must remain passable at all times. While I know this can be a frustrating endeavor as plows go by and plow in what was just shoveled, it is important to remember that roadways are the priority in order for emergency vehicles to move about town. Removal of snow soon after a snowfall will reduce the potential for it to turn to ice and be more difficult to remove later on. By doing so, we will be able to provide safe and passable sidewalks during the upcoming winter.

Also, in regard to garbage collection, please do not leave your pails out. They should not be put out until the night before your collection after 5:00pm and the empties need to be put out of sight by 8:00pm of the collection day. This will also ensure that the streets can be cleared for snow removal when needed. I thank everybody in advance for their efforts and cooperation.
