## The Mayor's Corner

I hope your summer is off to a great start and you are enjoying time with family and friends.

We had a very productive and informative Senior Citizens town hall meeting on June 12. The response was positive. and we plan on having more frequent town hall meetings in the future. Our next tentative general town hall meeting will be in September once the summer travel season has come to an end.

We recently learned that the New Jersey Turnpike Authority is planning to begin a major bridge repair project along the Garden State Parkway in Montvale and Woodcliff Lake starting later this year and continuing through 2026. The work that is being performed is extensive and will require temporary closures on Grand Avenue, Summit Avenue, and on the southbound ramp from Grand Avenue onto the Garden State Parkway. We have been in contact with the Turnpike Authority, the County, and our State Senator, and we are doing everything in our power to minimize the disruption and impact to our residents.

Right now, the schedule is for the project to be put out to bid in July of 2023, with work to commence in the fall of this year. We will remain in constant contact with the Turnpike Authority and the County to ensure that any lane closures, ramp closures, detours or other traffic impacts will be clearly communicated to our residents well in advance of any planned

construction.

There is a possibility of ramp closure and traffic disruption that can take anywhere

from one to two and a half years and the work may not start until later in 2024. What makes the situation more complex is that Exit 171 continues to be "No right turn" and only a referendum approved by the Borough

of Woodcliff Lake residents can make the change. This is a fluid situation and as soon as I have any additional information, I will provide updates on the Borough website, Facebook, and on Montvale TV Access.

Numerous residents in town have reported unauthorized credit inquiries on their accounts from American Express. ## **Tax Department**

The County of Bergen will not be certifying new tax rates at this time. Therefore, the Borough of Montvale will be sending out estimated tax bills for the 3RD QUARTER ONLY. You should be receiving them by the end of June. They are pink in color and the size of an envelope. Your final tax bill for the 2023 tax year will be mailed later this Fall.

Property taxes are due August 1, 2023. Grace period will be to Thursday, August 10. After August 10, interest will revert back to August 1.

# **Property Maintenance**

Happy Summer!

Property Maintenance--By ensuring safe, healthy places to live, work and play, it helps reduce the risk of declining property values and failing community pride.

Some friendly reminders in regard to garbage and lawns. Once garbage and/or recycling has been picked up remember to remove pails from street curb and put back to keep the streets clear. Rubbish shall not be placed in such designated areas earlier than 5:00 p.m. of the day prior to scheduled collections, and the empty receptacles shall be removed to areas not exposed to public view by 8:00 p.m. on the collection day. Please be courteous and maintain your lawn by cutting it weekly. Prune and maintain loose and overgrown branches on trees.

It is very important that you have signage for the numbering of your home either on your mailbox or the exterior of your home for emergency access in the event of an emergency. Check your numbers and make sure they are not weathered and if need be, please replace them.

We have come across vehicles that are being parked on front lawns and not in driveways on pavement. This is against code 305.7L No person shall park any automobile or vehicle on any premises utilized for residential purposes other than on driveways servicing said premises. Please help keep our community safe and clean.

## **Dismembered Deer**

This time of year, fawn and deer are more visible in our town. With that comes other wildlife, such as coyotes, which are the primary predator for deer. Unfortunately, this means that dismembered animals found on your property are not an unusual occurrence or cause for alarm. Although this may be disturbing, it is a part of nature, which we have an abundance of here in Bergen County. If you come across this on your property, you can dispose of it on your own by placing the dismembered limb in a garbage bag and putting it IN the garage or you can contact Tyco Animal Control to remove it for a fee of \$60. If you have any questions, you can reach Tyco Animal control at 201-652- 4554 and speak with a certified animal control officer. They will walk you through the entire process.
