Montvale Police Department

Please remember to remove keys and key fobs from your vehicles, and lock them as well. It is also important to understand that thieves may be able to start and take your vehicle if the fob is left within close proximity. Your key fob is constantly trying to communicate with your vehicle when you leave it too close. This can also be the cause of your key fob battery wearing out prematurely. Your fob should be kept as far away from the vehicle as possible, or placed in some type of protective covering that blocks the signal when not in use. Happy Holidays to you and your families.

Fire Prevention

As we wind down the Thanksgiving feast we are now looking forward to Christmas, Hanukkah and New Year's celebrations. Here are some helpful fire prevention tips to keep you and your family safe for a fun holiday season.

- 1. Check all Christmas tree lights for any wear and tear (exposed wires, worn plugs and connectors).
- 2. Keep your Christmas tree well hydrated through the holiday.
- 3. Keep Christmas trees away from all open flame devices i.e.; candles, fireplaces.
- 4. DO NOT LEAVE your Christmas lights operating while no one is home.
- 5. Keep all Hanukkah candles away from combustible materials.
- 6. Once again, if you are deep frying your holiday meal, keep your fryer 15 feet from any structure and off any decks.
- 7. Always check your smoke/carbon monoxide detectors for proper operation.

Property Maintenance

To all residents this is a friendly reminder of what is required from you for all residents to be safe when venturing out during the winter months around our beautiful town. You are required to maintain the sidewalks in front of your home § 347-26Removal of snow and ice. [Amended 4-9-1996 by Ord. No. 96-1021] A. The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of land abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks and gutters of the public streets, avenues, and highways within the limits of the Borough of Montvale shall remove all snow and ice from the same within 24 hours of daylight after the same shall have formed or fallen thereon. [Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II)] B. No person shall sweep, shovel, push, plow or throw snow or ice in or upon any public street, sidewalk or private property belonging to another, nor shall any person direct, permit or suffer another to so do any of the foregoing from any property owned, occupied, used or leased by such person.

Please try and abide by the law and keep your sidewalks clear from ice and snow. Also please take the time to cleaning around storm drains so melted snow can flow and not refreeze overnight.
