New Year, New Programs in the Childrens' Room at Montvale Public Library!

New Years' Day is the time to make resolutions and one resolution that benefits everyone is to visit the library weekly if not more often. But first, if you don't have one, get a library card. Children can get their own cards when they can write their names! Second, make sure you are getting our emails! If not, give us your email address and we will add it to our list.

Do you have a little one? We have a "Babies in the 'Brary" program that's just right! On January 5, 2023, bring your baby (up to 18 months) to the library and sing along with Ms. Liz, listen to stories and do some "lap" activities. The fun begins at 10:30 a.m. An added benefit is meeting other young families.

Chess is coming back in January on Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. ChessWired will be here in person to teach chess basics and play games. It's the perfect opportunity for kids just learning and for others to get some practice and develop new strategies. Registration is required for each session: January 5, 12, 19, 26. Come to one or come to all. No need to bring supplies; all materials will be provided.

There will be a Tot Storytime (toddlers ages 2 and older, with a grown-up) on January 10th at 10:30 a.m. Little ones will read stories and sing songs and meet new friends!

On January 11, at 4 p.m., Ms. Mary is offering another First Chapter Fun session. It's a reverse book club for kids in grades 4-6 who love reading but don't always know which book to choose. Ms. Mary will read the first chapter of three or four different books. Kids are introduced to new authors and different genres. All they have to do is sit back and listen.

Yoga Littles is especially geared to helping your little ones (ages 18 months-4 years with a grown-up) develop hand-eye coordination and motor skills through creative yoga poses and movements. Bozza Yoga returns to lead your little one on January 19th and 26th at 10:30 a.m. Registration is required for each session.

Property Maintenance

To all residents this is a friendly reminder of what is required from you for all residents to be safe when venturing out during the winter months around our beautiful town. § 347-26Removal of snow and ice. [Amended 4-9-1996 by Ord. No. 96-1021] A. The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of land abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks and gutters of the public streets, avenues and highways within the limits of the Borough of Montvale shall remove all snow and ice from the same within 24 hours of daylight after the same shall have formed or fallen thereon. [Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II)] B. No person shall sweep, shovel, push, plow or throw snow or ice in or upon any public street, sidewalk or private property belonging to another, nor shall any person direct, permit or suffer another to so do any of the foregoing from any property owned, occupied, used or leased by such person.

Please try and abide by the law and keep your sidewalks clear from ice and snow. Have a very Merry Christmas and Happy Holiday Season.




Tennis Court Badges

Each year residents who wish to use the courts must register to receive their new access card.

Badges for the 2023 season, which runs from March 1 - December 31, may be purchased at the Borough Hall (during normal business hours beginning) OR online: www.montvale. org/recreation

There will be a \$10 fee for replacement badges

The Recreation Department has updated the tennis court's magnetic card reader to a proximity reader. Badges will no longer need to be swiped, but rather just moved within a close proximity to the reader.
