The Mayor's Corner

Our efforts to attract quality retailers and commercial tenants are in full gear. I previously reported that Pottery Barn, William Sonoma, Fleming's Steakhouse and about 20 more businesses are moving to Montvale, while we strive to also become a medical hub. These efforts are supported by all members of the Montvale Council, the Chamber of Commerce and the Economic Development Committee, as well as members of the public who have introduced us to potential tenants. I gave several tours of our town to prospective commercial tenants and businesses looking for a new home.

I also reported that we are in the process of purchasing the last farm available in town as part of our strategic land acquisition plan. The last property we purchased, 28 acres at 127 Summit Ave, is under consideration for purchase by Veolia to install two badly-needed water tanks to help service the town and improve existing

water pressure issues. The remainder of the property is likely to be set aside for trails and other passive recreational purposes.

Huff Pond and the brook stabilization work is finally done with over 500 trees planted to support the stabilization, and I hope you find time to visit it and sit and enjoy the park's serenity.

Tax Department

The County of Bergen will not be certifying new tax rates at this time. Therefore, the Borough of Montvale will be sending out estimated tax bills for the 3RD QUARTER ONLY. Your final tax bill for the 2023 tax year will be mailed later this Fall.

Property taxes are due August 1, 2023. Grace period will be to Thursday, August 10. After August 10, interest will revert back to August 1.

Primary Election Information

Bergen County has implemented new voting machines for voters to use beginning this upcoming Primary Election, June 6, 2023. Voting hours are from 6:00am – 8:00pm.

1. Check in

Check in at any poll pad at your polling location to receive a programmed voter card containing your ballot.

2. Insert your voter card

Insert your voter card into the ballot marking device, follow the prompts to mark your ballot and print it out.

3. Scan your ballot

Scan your ballot into the scanner to cast your vote.

Applications and Hold Harmless forms must be completed and returned to the Recreation Department, Attn: Lisa Loranger, with Liability Insurance and payment. Forms are available online and at the Borough Hall front counter. Permits will not be issued if the application is incomplete. All organizations must receive an approved permit from Lisa Loranger prior to any field use.

FALL (AUGUST-DECEMBER) FIELD USE APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED MAY 1 - JUNE 1.

Applications submitted after June 1 will be processed once all previously submitted permits are fully processed.
