Fish with a First Responder (June)

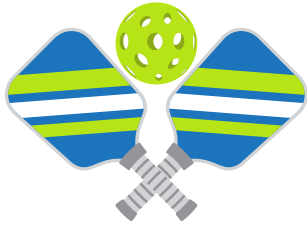

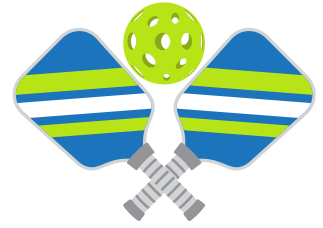
