The Mayor's Corner

On March 18, we held a Unity in the Valley symposium highlighted by New Jersey Attorney General Gurbir Grewal. I spoke at the event representing the Pascack Valley Mayors Association, and stressed that hate has no place here. Many thanks to our council President Elizabeth Gloeggler for participating on the joint committee and contributing to this event.

The budgets came back from all of the departments and were challenged by the Council Members. I am happy to report that for the second year in a row, our budget has remained flat while maintaining a healthy surplus above the five-million-dollar level, AAA bond rating, and continue to spend a million dollar a year on roads paving and maintenance of roads. Although we lost \$36 million in ratables due to the non-profit status of Memorial Sloan Kettering which started this year. We were able to add an additional \$20 million in ratables from other projects. We will have more ratable added as the new projects at the former A&P, Mercedes begin to generate revenue in the next few years.

My thanks to the finance committee headed by Councilman Tim Lane, all of the departments heads and staff for helping us to keep costs down.

Montvale Police Department

Welcome to Spring. April is National Distracted Driver Month, which is a time to remind New Jersey motorists of the State's distracted driving laws. These laws include a ban on hand-held cell phone use and text messaging by all drivers and a ban on all cell phone use (hand held or hands free) by novice drivers. The Montvale Police Department will be participating in the New Jersey State funded "U Drive. U Text. U Pay" campaign. Between April 1, and April 21, we will have extra Officers out on patrol specifically targeting distracted drivers.



During the 2018 Distracted Driving Crackdown, participating police agencies in the State issued 13,146 summonses for cell phone use/texting and 5,697 for careless driving. According to the State's website, between 2011 and 2015, over 804,000 New Jersey motor vehicle crashes involved a distracted driver. Operating a motor vehicle requires your full attention. Please put the phone down, and pay attention.

From the Construction Official & Property Maintenance Official

As we hopefully move into warmer weather and put this winter behind us, now comes the time for all the cleanup work. From the property maintenance perspective, all property owners will need to look at their property for damage. Heavy ice and snow can pull gutters away from the house as well as break branches off from trees. The freeze/thaw cycle which damages municipal roads does the same to driveways, although to a lesser degree. Ice dams that occur along roof edges can cause damage to interior drywall and finishes. Pool gates and fences can be damaged by falling branches and result in loss of protection for the pool enclosure. Concrete sidewalks can heave from frost creating a tripping hazard. Most of these items are considered general repair and maintenance and do not require building permits but do need to be addressed under our property maintenance code. Please check with the building department office if you are unsure as to the permit requirements.

Finally, thanks to all who tried their best to maintain passable sidewalks. I know it was difficult given the volume of snow we once again received and the lack of a place to put it. But your cooperation and efforts were very much appreciated. Hopefully, we can look forward now to a beautiful spring and put this winter behind us.

From the Construction Department

The Construction Department conducts Continuing Certificate of Occupancy (CCO) inspections for all residential and commercial property sales and change of tenants in the borough. In the course of conducting this type of inspection, we are experiencing a large number of failed inspections due to the replacement of a water heater at some point in time. As a matter of policy, we check our files for the issuance of a permit covering the replacement of a water heater and if none is found, the inspection fails. The responsible party then needs to hire a licensed plumber to sign and seal a permit so that a water heater inspection can be done and the CCO ultimately issued. This process can delay a closing and also can subject the property owner for fines and penalties for not obtaining a permit.

If you are planning to sell or rent any property or space in the borough, it would be wise to make sure all the required permits were secured for things like water heaters, finished basements, and various home improvements. If you are unsure if a permit is required, please contact the Construction Department and we will advise you as to what permits may be needed.
