The Mayor's Corner

This month we held our 9/11 Ceremony attended by our community, guest speakers, first responders and the Boys and Girls Scouts with performances by the Pascack Hills Chamber Choir and Ms. Zita Stratis. A moving and somber talk given to us by first responder John Nichols, who was on the scene as he shared his experience and photos he had taken.

This month I was notified by SUEZ that our town is currently lead-free. However, if your home was built before 1985, there is a 15% chance that the internal plumbing of the house may contain lead. I urge you to have your water tested annually and remediate it quickly. We also completed the road paving project for this year in time before school started. We do have some money left to possibly pave one or two smaller roads; we are waiting on the final analysis from the engineer. We also had a group of volunteers from Scouts, the Fire Department and Environmental Commission who helped clean Huff Pond and removed debris from the perimeter, to prepare it for the full dredging that will take place in the spring. We thank everyone who took time Mayor Michael Ghassali on a Sunday morning to help with the cleanup.



I held a town hall meeting on September 16, and discussed several town issues with residents. These informal meetings are meaningful to me and to members of the Council as we can exchange ideas and discuss issues as a community. As we move into the fall season, we begin to prepare for our 2020 budget.

I look forward to seeing you at the meetings and wish you and your families all the best.



Regular Medicare participants must bring Medicare Part B card for us to bill the insurance company.



Borough of Montvale Plastic Bag Recycling Program



Starting on September 15, 2019 the Borough of Montvale NJ will start collecting plastic bags at locations around their town as part of a local plastic recycling program. Under the supervision of the Montvale Environmental Commission, the Borough will be collecting specific types of plastic bags which are currently not being properly recycled. The plastic bags will be brought to a manufacturer called Trex who will be reusing the plastic as part of their composite decking manufacturing process. Trex has agreed that in return for receiving 500 pounds

of plastic bags within a 6 month period time, they will provide Montvale with a park bench. The program will run until March 15, 2020, so the Borough of Montvale asks residents to please bring all of their plastic bags to one of the locations noted below so they can reach their recycling goals.

The plastic bag drop-off locations in Montvale will be:

- 1. Montvale Recycling Center on Memorial Drive
- 2. Montvale Community and Senior Center on Memorial Drive
- 3. Montvale Library at 12 Mercedes Drive
- 4. Montvale Memorial School
- 5. Montvale Fieldstone School
- 6. Pascack Hills High School

The type of plastic they are accepting is limited to plastic bags, NOT plastic bottles or any type of plastic that is at all rigid (crinkles) or does not stretch. The recycle number found on much of the material they accept is #2 and #4 and typical examples are shown on the diagram below. Please ensure the bags are dry, clean, and empty so the volunteers in Montvale can handle them safely. If you have any questions they can be addressed to the Montvale Environmental Commission through the montvale.org website using their "I Want To...ask a question" link found on the top right of the montvale.org main landing page.

As a point of interest, the average weight of a bag is 5.5 grams so the goal is 41,235 bags needed to reach the 500 lb. goal. (1 lb = 453.59237 g)

From the Property Maintenance Dept.- Fall Leaves

As I was driving into work last week, I noticed a somewhat subtle change occurring. It seems there were some very early signs of leaves changing color which can only mean that we are transitioning into the fall season. While it may be your favorite season because of cooler temperatures and beautiful colors, it also has its problems such as what to do with all those leaves.

As a reminder to all residents, all leaves must be in compostable paper bags. Curbside leaf collection begins in mid-October and runs through December 31, 2019. Branches and twigs will NOT be picked up at this time.

Secondly, please be aware that leaves cannot be piled in the street as they eventually make their way into the storm drains and require a lot of time and money to clean out. Also, leaves piled in the street and subsequently snowed upon make it extremely difficult to clear the streets safely. If you use a landscape contractor to clean your yard, kindly make them aware of these requirements so as to minimize the risk of fines for non-compliance.

If we all can follow these simple rules, it will certainly make it easier to keep the town looking great as we enjoy the change of season.
