Happy New Year and welcome to 2020. I hope that everyone has enjoyed the holidays and starting to get back to reality. We are planning to budget for additional funding to mill and pave more roads. The work on the Magnolia Bridge will soon begin and will likely last for the year. The Bridge will be closed and we will have detours and additional traffic controls to ensure a smooth transition during this period.

The work on the former Mercedes buildings is in progress with the first office tenant scheduled to move in December 2020. There will be a mixed use of office space, retail stores, 308 residential units, a hotel, a dinein theater and an open plaza for summer time activities.

The eastern part of the property, downhill from the back of Wegmans, is a four acre plot that will eventually have additional retail stores during the last phase of

the project.
