The Mayor's Corner

I want to wish you a Happy New Year and a Merry Christmas, and Happy Hanukah. In a way I am happy to close out this year and start a new year with hopes and optimism. I also think that this year brought us closer to each other to our families. I saw many good wills and many residents offering to help the community in ways I have never seen before in my last 10 years of public service. I am grateful to all those who stepped up in time of need and offered their time and talent to help others in our community.

There are several projects happening across the border in the Village of Chestnut Ridge on School House Road. We are fully aware of the projects and we are going to have legal and professional engineering and planning representation at their meetings. These projects will impact the local traffic in our town and we will work cooperatively with the Village of Chestnut Ridge to minimize the traffic impact to our town.

The road paving program is completed for this year and we are in the process of compiling the 2021 list. Although we were short on revenue in 2020 because

of COVID expenses and hotel tax revenue

shortage, we will attempt to budget to continue with the road paving program so we don't fall behind. PSE&G will be completely repaving all roads they opened, that were paved in the last 5 years. The roads that were paved more than five years ago, they will pave midway to curb.

Currently we are seeking nurses and retired nurses to take part in the process and we will have a designated location to administer the vaccine, once we have it and have the green light to proceed.

Rabies Clinic

The Montvale Board of Health has decided, with an abundance of caution, to cancel the 2021 Rabies Vaccination Clinic. Past clinics have always been well attended. However, enforcement of CDC guidelines limits capacity of the garage which results in longer wait times and decreased safety for all.

Pet Owners are required by Borough ordinance to license their pet(s) and are encouraged to do so through mail or in person at Borough Hall during normal business hours. Please visit your pet's veterinarian for a rabies vaccination if the vaccination expires prior to November 1, 2021. Fire Prevention



Now that the winter season is upon us, if you have a fire hydrant in front of your home please keep it clear of snow when shoveling your driveway and sidewalks. Please have all walkways and stairs clear of snow and ice into your home. This will allow easier access for Fire Department personnel to enter your home in case you have an emergency. Discard all dried out Christmas trees to the outside.

Check and maintain ALL SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS for proper operation. If you have an EMERGENCY DIAL 911.

Montvale Volunteer Fire Department

The Montvale Fire Department is made up of 35 volunteer firefighters that provide fire protection to the Borough of Montvale 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 52 weeks a year. We are starting a membership drive and are looking for new members to join us. No experience is necessary and free training is provided. If you are a resident of Montvale and 16 to 18 years old you can become a Junior firefighter. If you are 18 years old or over, you can become a regular firefighter.

If you would like to help your fellow neighbors, stop down at the fire house on the first, second, or fourth Thursday of the month at 8 PM or call the fire house at (201)391-4240 and leave a message and somebody will get in touch with you.


